Treatment of the Observations.--The observations with star A, plotted separately, showed somewhat more dispersion than the B observations. Furthermore, the smooth curve laid through the B observations looked as if it could be represented theoretically. This was not the case with the smooth curve through the A observations. The residuals of the individual B observations from the B curve gave a probable error of 0.026 for a single observation. The frequency curve of the residuals is closely in...
